




Tommy the tortoise lived in a field by himself. "I wish I could run fast like all the other animals," he said.

Tommy heard a noise in the sky and saw an eagle. "I wish I had my shell to protect me," he said. He quickly hid in the hole of a tree.




Tommy started to run again. He heard thunder and felt the rain on his back. "I wish I had my shell to protect me," he said.
