SARCHI CHAIR IN GLOBAL CHANGE AND SOCIAL LEARNING SYSTEMS' TRANSFORMING EDUCATION FOR SUSTAINABLE FUTURES (TESF) PROJECT AT RHODES UNIVERSITY

The Environmental Learning Research Centre (ELRC) at Rhodes university is the home of a vibrant and diverse community of scholars and environmental education practitioners, and forms a regional hub of environmental learning innovation. The centre hosts a postgraduate research programme of between 50-60 Masters and PhDs scholars. The centre increasingly works with local, national, regional and international partners to develop research-informed and research-led short and certificate courses and enjoys collaborative partnerships with over 50 partners across the world. One such partnership is with the Transforming Education for Sustainable Futures (TESF) network which supports collaborative research to develop understanding of how education systems can act as drivers of sustainable development in India, Rwanda, Somalia/Somaliland and South Africa. The TESF is funded by the Global Challenges Research Fund through the Economic and Social Research Council Network Plus scheme. It is coordinated out of the University of Bristol and works with partners in India, Rwanda, Somalia/Somaliland, South Africa, the United Kingdom and the Netherlands. It is due to run for three and a half years, from November 2019 to April 2023.
